
Way2Go 2014 Program Report

Case Study

Partnerships and Persistence Pay Off

For years, Way2Go has been working with 12 of our local schools to build relationships, provide transportation education, and overcome individual and systemic transportation barriers among school families. School staff that we train as Transportation Liaisons have become increasingly proactive in engaging colleagues to solve transportation problems. In fall of 2014, we rolled out two new highly collaborative initiatives: actively promoting ridesharing among extra curricular activity groups, and making public transit bus passes available to students who can use them to participate in school-based activities.

As a result, scores of individual families have been able to get to school meetings, events and activities, and make other trips as well. Ridesharing is expanding from isolated pockets to become more of a norm. Sports coaches and student athletes, and other activity leaders and students have gotten excited about using public transit when feasible. These small interventions are expanding opportunities and may even shift the life trajectories of individual students and families for the better. Moreover, we are gradually creating a school community culture where transportation access is seen as a right and collective responsibility.
